Homework will be assigned each time that we meet. As a rule, it is due at the beginning of the following class. Late homework *will not be accepted for any reason*.

In addition to regular (textbook problems) homework, six supplemental assignments will be assigned during the semester. Each of these assignments carries the same number of points as a regular homework.

FORM

Please follow strictly the formatting requirements below:

- Homework should be submitted on letter-size paper (8.5" × 11"). No fringes, please.
- You may write on both sides of the paper.
- Your name and textbook section should be written at the top of every page.
- Problems should be separated by an end-to-end horizontal line.
- Problem number should be clearly marked at the beginning. If a problem breaks across multiple pages, the problem number should be marked at the beginning of every new page.
- Each problem should be neatly written, with all intermediate steps included. Written explanations should be included wherever appropriate.
- Multiple pages should be stapled together.

Exceptionally, homework may be submitted by email<sup>1</sup> or via the D2L Dropbox feature<sup>2</sup>.

GRADING

- Homework will be graded for its academic value. No points will be awarded for effort only.
- There will be no extra credit.
- Illegible work will not be graded.
- For some assignments, only selected problems may be graded (this will *not* be announced in advance).

<sup>1</sup>Homework submitted by email must be in one of the following formats: plain text (.txt), L<sup>A</sup>T<sub>E</sub>X(.tex), Portable Document Format (.pdf), Rich Text Format (.rtf), MS Word Document (.doc), or scanned handwriting in one of the following formats: .jpg, .gif or .png. The same deadline (date and hour) applies for homework submitted by email. Homework sent by email should be sent to the email address noted below, and should be sent from your **arizona.edu** email address.

- Each homework will be scored on a 10 point scale. The lowest 3 homework scores will be dropped. The remaining homework scores will be added and scaled down to a 50–point maximum, which will be counted towards your final grade. <sup>3</sup>
